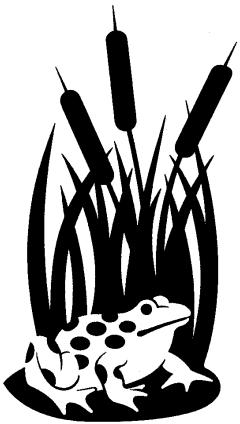


2012 Kayaking Internship at Silver Lake Nature Center

Summary: Silver Lake Nature Center is looking for energetic, creative individuals to fill internship positions. The summer position will run 20-40 hours a week, is unpaid but will include housing. Internships are set to begin on/about May 15th and end on/about August 15th. The intern will be required to work with all our kayak programs, including pre-trips, preparation, cleanup, and maintenance of equipment. The intern will also be required to help in other aspects of the Nature Center's activities including but not limited to: public interpretive walks; summer group programs; invasive species management, and grounds keeping.

Qualifications:

- > Ability to work well with others
- > Experience working with people of all ages, backgrounds, and ability levels
- > Ability to sustain energy levels throughout the summer
- > At least 1 year of College
- > Background in outdoor recreation, environmental science, education and/or biology
- > Passion for the mission of Silver Lake Nature Center which is to promote the awareness of the natural environment and foster stewardship through fun, environmental education and land preservation.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee regularly works in outside weather conditions. The noise level in the work environment is usually moderate.
