Intermountain Oil and Gas BMP Project

The Center operates a comprehensive, free-access, searchable, web-based database of oil and gas best management practices for the Intermountain West. See www.oilandgasbmeps.org. Interns help expand the database and website, collect source documents for the database, maintain the document library (electronic and hard copy), extract BMPs and other data elements from documents, write and edit the website materials, input data, and help develop workshops and trainings.

Red Lodge Clearinghouse Project

The Center also maintains a natural resource policy focused website to support, connect and inform the partners of collaborative efforts and others addressing natural resource challenges in their community.
