Watershed Monitoring Project Manager

Summary: Silver Lake Nature Center is looking for an energetic, self-motivated, creative individual to fill an internship position. The position will run for 12 to 16 weeks at 30 - 40 hours a week. The pay is \$10 per hour. Internships may begin on/about May 15th and end on/about August 15th. The intern will be required to work with Nature Center staff to develop a watershed monitoring program. Activities may include but are not limited to: communicating with varied organizations and volunteers; kayaking; endangered species turtle study; invasive species management, and grounds keeping.

The intern will be expected to complete the project within the given time frame.

Qualifications:

- ✓ Ability to work well with others
- ✓ Background in environmental science, education or biology
- ✓ Ability to sustain energy levels throughout the summer
- ✓ At least 2 years of College
- ✓ Experience with watershed monitoring is a plus, but not required
- ✓ Passion for the mission of Silver Lake Nature Center (SLNC) which is to use education, recreation, and research to inspire students of all ages and abilities to preserve Silver Lake and its watershed
